## **SECTION II**

- A. SCOPE: Students of Music 172 will rehearse and perform a varied array of choral literature. Technical mastery of vocal techniques and appropriate stylistic practices will be emphasized, as well as note reading and music fundamentals.

- C. ATTENDANCE AND PARTICIPATION: Students are expected to attend all rehearsals and to be punctual to all rehearsals, as well as completely engage in all musical activities presented to the student.
