What is SNAP Education & Training?

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program's Education and Training Scholarships provides short-term job training and support services to eligible individuals receiving nutritional assistance. Full scholarships are offered for a variety of certificate programs in multiple employment industries.



Am I eligible?

You may be eligible if you:

- Receive SNAP benefits from the Department of Social Services;
- Are not receiving TFA/TANF (cash assistance);
- Are able and motivated to obtain employment upon successful completion of your program;
- And have not previously received a SNAP E&T scholarship.

* Final scholarship eligibility is determined by the program coordinator in collaboration with the Connecticut Department of Social Services

How do I apply?

- Choose your career interest and education and training program from the many choices available to you.
- Complete and submit a SNAP E & T Application. These are available for download from the website, capitalcc.edu/SNAP or by stopping by the office at: Capital Community College, 950 Main Street, Room 316, Hartford CT, 06103
